Why we need your help?

- A safe day center, in operation since 1998, accommodating the most vulnerable in Montréal
- The Action Centre allows you to keep fit, keep the mind active and restores interest in life
- Education and social programs geared towards healthy lifestyles and quality of life
- Government housing, along with caregivers do not offer our educational and recreational services
- Over 50% live in subsidized Government housing some of whom are mandated to leave their residence 3 days per week for 'structured activity'
- Healthcare attendants ensure the adult members maintain daily hygiene.
- The Action Centre has demonstrated its sound administration when it costs \$38.52 per day, while a similar center in Mississauga (Ontario) offers these services for \$71.60 per day per person.
- 90%+ of our members live on government disability incomes of \$9 600 annually
- Some of our members are rewarded by performing useful work for the Center which enhances their self-esteem

- Assist members to reintegrate into society through philanthropy and education
- Encourage members to learn and achieve to the best of their ability
- Create public awareness about the needs of disabled people living below the line of poverty

- Promote independence and reduce isolation
- Teach our members to be proactive when it comes to taking care of their health
- Promote mutual support, trust and acceptance
- Enhance self-esteem and reduce risk of depression
- Offer hope for a better future


Educational Services


2010 Revenue Breakdown
